Compliance

The Off-Site Reaffirmation Committee found support for the institution's case for compliance.

The Off-Site Reaffirmation Committee reviewed documentation of the institution's program coordination policies, procedures, supporting forms, and a comprehensive list of program coordinator qualifications. The institution's academic program coordinators are appointed full-time faculty members qualified in the appropriate field, or the chair/director of the department/school and approved by the college dean to ensure that the program contains essential curricular components, has appropriate content and pedagogy, and reflects decisions of the program's faculty. All program coordinators possess appropriate faculty credentials and are qualified in fields appropriate to the area of coordination. The content, quality, and effectiveness of the curriculum rests with the faculty. Program oversight is complemented by faculty curriculum committees and other review groups that provide governance and oversight at the department/school, college, and institutional levels. The process of curriculum development and review is governed by ACAF 2.00 Creation and Revision of Academic Programs, and ACAF 2.03 Creation and Revision of Academic Courses, and the Academic Program Liaison (APL) Committee, comprising representatives from each of the colleges, schools, and comprehensive campuses of the institution, has served as an additional level of quality control on program coordination.
