## I. Abstract

The primary mission of the University of South Carolina is the education of the state's diverse citizens through teaching, research, creative activity and service. Founded in 1801, the USC system is the largest university in the state, serving more than 50,000 students from its flagship Columbia campus, three comprehensive campuses (Aiken, Beaufort, and Upstate), and four regional campuses (Lancaster, Salkehatchie, Sumter, and Union).

The University of South Carolina Lancaster, a regional campus of the University of South Carolina, has as its mission to provide higher education and intellectual leadership to its service area, which includes Lancaster, Chester, Chesterfield, Fairfield, Kershaw, and York Counties. Its mission and vision statements were approved by the University's Board of Trustees in June 2016:

To better serve constituents in the fast-growing northern part of Lancaster county, as well as adjacent communities in York County (due to the explosive growth of the metropolitan Charlotte, NC region), USC Lancaster established an educational site in Indian Land, SC, in the fall of 2018. The physical address of the site is 8063 River Road, Fort Mill, SC 29707.

Initial course offerings at the site comprised less than $50 \%$ of courses applicable towards an associate's degree, and SACSCOC was notified of this in early 2018 (Appendix C). Instructional methods employed for these courses consisted of traditional in-class, on-site instruction, with USCapproved faculty members traveling to the site and teaching their classes.

Population growth and demographic changes within the target population have led to a demonstrated demand for additional courses at the site. In order to be able to meet its mission of serving these students, USC Lancaster is seeking approval from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges to offer more than $50 \%$ of its Associate degrees at the Indian Land site (8063 River Road, Fort Mill, SC 29707).

## II. Determination of the Need for Change/Relationship to Mission/Planning and Approvals for Change

## A. Background

USC Lancaster was established by an act of the South Carolina General Assembly in 1959 (R220, S213, Act No. 126) which created the Lancaster County Commission for Higher Education, whose stated purpose is "the encouragement of higher education in Lancaster county and adjacent areas and, more specifically, the establishment in Lancaster County of facilities to offer standard freshman and sophomore college courses, and such other courses as deemed desirable." The Commission then entered an agreement with the University of South Carolina to begin offering higher educational courses in Lancaster County.

The "Lancaster Extension Center" opened in fall, 1959, in a single building in downtown Lancaster (the "Williams House,"), offering six courses taught by four commuting professors. Fifty students enrolled for the first semester.

To meet increasing demands, the Commission raised funds and purchased a fifteen acre tract of land north of the city and began construction on Hubbard Hall, which officially opened in September 1965 and is the original building on the current USCL campus.

Further expansion occurred in 1969 with the opening of Starr Hall. By the end of the 1960s, student enrollment was around 250 , with over 40 courses being offered by fifteen resident faculty and four commuting faculty members.

Growth remained a constant over the next several decades. The Medford Library was constructed (1974), followed by the establishment of the Gregory Health and Wellness Center (1981), which served campus and community members.

In 1996, USC Lancaster began its "Building on a Tradition of Excellence" campaign, which raised more than $\$ 8$ million (the largest amount ever raised by a USC regional campus). This campaign, along with $\$ 2.7$ million in state appropriated funds, led to the opening of the James Bradley Arts \& Sciences Building in May 2000, which included classrooms, science labs, a large auditorium, and a multi-purpose room for campus and community use.

In 2005, USC Lancaster acquired the former University Baptist Church (adjacent to the existing campus), renovating the space for faculty \& staff offices as well as a variety of health clinics.

In 2012, the Educational Foundation of USCL reached an agreement with the City of Lancaster to establish a Native American Studies Center on Main Street, which houses the Native American Studies Archive, the campus' extensive collection of Catawba Indian pottery, faculty office and classroom space, and offers a wide variety of educational programming for students, faculty, visiting scholars, and the general public.

In fall 2014, USCL opened Founders Hall, a 40,000 square foot building on campus with faculty offices, a variety of classrooms, as well as an art studio and gallery.

Finally, in fall 2018, at the request of local officials, the University began offering a limited number of courses at the Indian Land site (which is the subject of this proposal).

Now serving a student population of nearly 1900, USC Lancaster's physical campus is approximately 150 acres and nearly 300,000 feet of classroom and office space. The campus is well poised to meet current and future needs for much of its service area, but the growth and demographic changes in the northern parts of Lancaster and York Counties has led to a demonstrated need for the campus to establish a more easily-accessible presence to fulfill its mission of service to all citizens of the region.

## B. Assessment of Need and Program Planning/Approval

South Carolina adults are, by and large, undereducated. According to recent statistics, only $25.1 \%$ of South Carolinians earn a bachelor's, graduate, or other professional degree, approximately $5 \%$ below the national average. https://statisticalatlas.com/state/South-Carolina/Educational-Attainment

South Carolina's population has grown approximately 9\% since 2010, with York and Lancaster Counties growing at about twice the average rate of the state. This growing population underscores the need for the site in Indian Land and is the primary reason for the request to offer more than $50 \%$ of courses required for an associate's degree at the USC Lancaster campus. https://www.heraldonline.com/news/local/article211810074.html

The establishment of the Indian Land site in Fall 2018 was geared largely to a non-traditional audience, with courses being offered in the evenings, thus allowing working adults to enroll in classes at a convenient location and time. Expansion of these course offerings will enable USC Lancaster not only to offer more options for non-traditional students, but also to serve area traditional-aged undergraduate students by offering courses throughout the day.

## III. Description of Change - New Off-Campus Site

## A. Courses

USC Lancaster's academic program and its faculty are divided into three academic divisions:

- Humanities
- Math, Science, Nursing \& Public Health
- Business, Behavioral Sciences, Criminal Justice \& Education

Each academic division is led by a chair, elected by the faculty within that particular division for a three-year term.

Course offerings at the Indian Land site in fall 2018 were determined by a discussion between the Associate Dean for Academic \& Student Affairs and the three academic division chairs. The final schedule represented an attempt to offer high-demand courses within the widest variety of potential majors/degree programs, but was also based on the availability of instructors who expressed a willingness to teach on the new site and during the late afternoon \& evening hours.

All courses offered in fall 2018 at the Indian Land site either met specific requirements of the Carolina Core (the University of South Carolina's general education core for all baccalaureate degrees), or met specific requirements for USCL's associate's degrees (which include the Carolina Core), or could be used by students as elective credit for an associate's or bachelor's degree. The courses offered were:

These seven courses, each of which carries with it three credit hours, comprise $35 \%$ of the classes ( 21 out of 60 credit hours) needed for completion of an associate's degree.

Two of the courses - specifically ENGL and SPAN - have additional requirements (ENGL 102 and SPAN 110) which need to be offered on the Indian Land site. The addition of these two courses, along with any additional course, would reach the " $50 \%$ of degree" mark.

Course offerings on the site will vary, based on demand and instructor availability. The intent at this time is not to offer all courses required for an Associate's degree at the Indian Land site in any systematic fashion, but rather to meet the needs of area students by providing a wide variety of highly sought-after courses at a location and at times convenient for both traditional and non-traditional students.

## B. Admissions

## C. Curriculum

There is no set curriculum at the Indian Land site. A variety of courses will be offered for traditional and non-traditional students. As noted above, these courses can be applied towards the completion of the Associate of Arts, Associate of Science and Associate of Nursing degrees.

## V. Library \& Learning Resources

Medford Library at USC Lancaster was established to support "the curricular, scholarly, and pedagogical needs of USC Lancaster students, faculty, and staff." Two tenured faculty librarians and one staff librarian ensure access to library resources and books both in hard copy and electronic formats.

The following indicate the numbers of the various kinds of resources housed in and offered by Medford Library:

734 - audio-visual materials

The physical library is 25 minutes from the Indian Land location. Students will be able to request materials from PASCAL and Interlibrary Loan and place physical materials on hold at Medford Library. Their pick up location will be Medford Library and they will need to come to the library with their Carolina Card to check materials out. ## VI. Student Support Services

USC Lancaster provides numerous student support services which will be extended to students choosing to enroll at the new Indian Land Location. The following lists the services and offers a brief description:

Admissions: Services provided by the USC Lancaster Office of Admissions and Records will be available to students at the Indian Land Location. Admissions support services will be available on site in Indian Land as needed.

Academic Tutoring: USC Lancaster subscribes to the online tutoring service Brainfuse. Students gain access to the services in Brainfuse service through links on our website and through Blackboard.

Disability Services: Students at the Indian Land Location will be served through our Disabilities Services Coordinator at USC Lancaster. Registration for disability services takes place through the USC Lancaster website and accommodations are determined by the Office of Disability Services. Accommodations are approved on a case by case basis, and are governed by the American with Disabilities Act (ADA) and / or Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. Site visits to the Indian Land Location for
consultations will be scheduled as necessary and accommodations will be provided on site as deemed appropriate.

Financial Aid Counseling/Veterans Affairs: The USC Lancaster Office of Financial Aid and Veterans Affairs will process and support students eligible for financial aid and other services (veteran and active duty) from the USC Lancaster campus. Financial aid counseling and veteran support will be available on site in Indian Land as needed.

Personal Counseling: Personal Counseling will be available to students taking courses at the Indian Land Location through the contracted online and telephonic service MyGroup. Additionally, students can consult with the fulltime personal counselor at USC Lancaster by phone or in person at USC Lancaster.

Careers and Internships/Jobs Page: USC Lancaster maintains on its website resources for students as they near completion of their degrees and begin the transition to their professional careers. These resources include internship lists, a job vacancy listing, career exploration resources, and C.V./resume samples, tips, and strategies.

Bookstore: Follett Higher Education manages the USC Lancaster bookstore. Students at the Indian Land Location can pre-order their textbooks through the bookstore website and books will be delivered to the Indian Land Location for student pick up.

## VII. Physical Resources

The Indian Land site is in an existing Lancaster County School District high school with adequate physical resources to accommodate initial enrollments with room for growth.

The district has allocated a sufficient number of classrooms and designated an entrance to control access after normal school day hours. Each classroom is equipped with sufficient technology to facilitate instruction with minimal to no additional equipment requirements from USC Lancaster.

Being that the program is occupying an existing educational facility, all basic infrastructure needs are met. There are no immediate equipment needs; however, as enrollments increase and more space is allocated over time, USC Lancaster will likely need to provide additional desks, office furniture, audio visual equipment and access to other technology.

The Indian Land location will not have a substantive impact on existing programs and services.

## IX. Institutional Evaluation \& Assessment Processes

Assessment of all academic courses is done through course evaluations, onsite observations, and through the University of South Carolina Assessment procedure. For courses which meet Carolina Core requirements, assessment is coordinated through the office of Palmetto College, which prepares an annual assessment report.

Because USC Lancaster awards three specialized associate's degrees (Business, Criminal Justice, and Nursing), courses which meet requirements for these degrees are also assessed in an on-campus process, either through an established accreditation process (e.g., ACBSP for the Associate's in Business degree, the NCLEX for the Associate's degree in nursing, etc.).

Course evaluations address topics such as quality of instruction, adequacy of facilities, adequacy of library resources, technology, and faculty availability (outside of class time).

Learning outcomes for students enrolled at USC Lancaster who take courses at the Indian Land site are included in the annual assessment reports for all associate's degree programs.
