The University of South Carolina Columbia is closing the Associate in Science (A.S.) degree program in Technical Nursing. Students who are currently enrolled in the program have been informed of its closure and were given the option of completing their degree as originally planned, or transferring to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (B.S.N.) program. Students will not face disruption or additional expense with either option. Coursework, advising and other support services will continue to be provided until the final cohort's expected graduation of May 2023. No faculty or staff members will be impacted by the closure.

The Board of Trustees of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges approves the closure of the Associate in Science (A.S.) degree program in Technical Nursing.
