ARTE 260: Interdisciplinary Relationships in the Arts (3 credit hours)

Course Description:

The study of relationships among visual arts, music, theatre, and dance

SAMPLE COURSE OVERVIEW

This course aims to acquaint students with the distinctive qualities, principles and elements of the visual arts, musical arts, theater arts, kinesthetic arts and cinematic arts, and to provide an understanding of how these art forms have application to human experience.

ITEMIZED LEARNING OUTCOMES

<u>Upon successful completion of ARTE 260, students will be able to:</u>

- 1. Define and use the language of visual, musical, performing, kinesthetic and cinematic arts.
- 2. Recognize commonalities and interrelationships of these art forms and compare and contrast these interrelationships with their own experiences.
- 3. Investigate various art forms that may be implemented into their own classrooms, employment, research, life and enjoyment, or personal aesthetic engagement activities and/or disciplines.
- 4. Critically reflect on course content and their personal experiences with four outside of class art events.

SAMPLE REQUIRED TEXTS/SUGGESTED READINGS/MATERIALS

- 2. Supplementary Readings: At different times there may be other required articles beyond the required text that the instructor will assign during the semester.

 - c. Access to email that is associated with Blackboard. Email will be the primary means for the professor to communicate with the student. It should be checked everyday
 - d. A digital camera or smart phone with picture taking ability
 - e. Journal for note taking in class and at the 4 required art events

SAMPLE ASSIGNMENTS AND/OR EXAM

- 1. Syllabus Quiz On the first day of class the syllabus will be available on Blackboard. You are to download and review the Syllabus PowerPoint found in Blackboard then take the syllabus quiz. This quiz will be most important for full knowledge of how the semester will unfold.
- You will be required to attend 4 Art Events outside of class. Tickets must be brought to
 the professor and recorded in order to get credit for the event. In addition to seeing the
 art event, students will be required to post a critical essay. Specifications for the essay
 will be discussed in class.
- The student will be required to keep a daily Blog. The blog will be based on all notes, reflections, pictures and other required work assigned. Blog entries are due at 10 AM before the next day's class.
- 4. There will be a total of **2 exams**, **a midterm** and **a final**. Exams shall cover the textbook and required readings as well as pertinent information from arts venues, lectures, and PowerPoint.
