Call for Abstracts | Deadline October 13th, 2024

The Graduate Students in Linguistics (GSLING) at the University of South Carolina are excited to announce that abstract submissions are now open for our annual Spring Student Research Symposium. This year's symposium will be an **in-person event**, held at the University of South Carolina, on **Saturday, November 16th, 2024** (times TBA). This year's theme, **Language, Society and Cognition**, aims to showcase student research across many subfields of linguistics and language research. Our keynotes this year feature research talks from Dr. Peter De Costa (Michigan State University) and Dr. Olesya Kisselev (University of South Carolina).

We gladly invite abstract submissions from undergraduate and graduate students in language-related disciplines, including linguistics, anthropology, education, psychology, and philosophy. Paper presentations are 20 minutes long, followed by a 5-minute Q&A period. Undergraduate students and early-career graduate students (first and second year) are especially encouraged to apply to our new, additional presentation opportunity, the Poster Presentation Session, during which time attendees may walk around and interact one-on-one with presenters and get to know you and your work!

Submissions should highlight projects that for which data analysis will be completed by the date of the conference (November 16th). Project proposals are not accepted at this time. Abstracts for both the Poster and Paper presentations should be no longer than 500 words, excluding references, with an additional page if necessary for figures and tables. Abstracts will undergo blind review, **so author names should not appear anywhere on abstracts, and any other identifying information should be removed from the abstract**. Abstracts with identifying information will not be considered.

The deadline for abstract submission is Sunday, October 13th. Those accepted will be notified no later than Friday, October 25th. Please follow this link to submit an abstract through EasyAbstracts: https://easyabs.linguistlist.org/conference/GSLING_SRS_Fall_2024/
