

# **Program Level Objectives**

- Apply skills in scholarly activity through research experience and scholarly deliverables

- Establish teaching philosophy, style, and preceptorship excellence through educational deliverables in the USC COP curriculum
- Manage and maintain an ambulatory clinical practice site while balancing concurrent academic responsibilities

### **Eligibility Requirements**

- Pharm.D. from ACPEaccredited pharmacy school
- Graduate (or anticipated) from PGY1 or PGY2 program (All specialty or interest areas encouraged to apply)
- Strong interest in academia and desire for academic role after completion of fellowship
- Eligible for pharmacist licensure in South Carolina
- Complete application through USC

- Opens: October 1, 2025
- Deadline: January 15, 2026
- Reviewed on a rolling basis until position is filled
